PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This program consists of 2 full-day sessions and 1 half-day, each with opportunities for participants to engage fully in discussions and debate.



RISK APPETITE & CAPACITY

- Participants will explore how risk appetite and capacity drives day to day decisions.
- Specialized knowledge of risk from an asset manager's perspective.

RISK IDENTIFICATION

- Risk identification in a financial services context, including regulatory definitions and expectations.
- A framework for considering global risks and trends as they relate to strategic decision making.

MEASUREMENT & PROFILE ASSESSMENT

- Participants will explore approaches to assess and measure interconnected events.
- *A deep dive into the three key risk areas of financial risk: credit, market, and operational risk.*
- *A presentation on Technology Enabled Risk Tools using emerging practices in AI and machine learning.*

RISK GOVERNANCE, COMMUNICATIONS & ACTIONS

- Participants will learn about the role of boards. Specific focus on the executive transition and a changing role from "doing" to "influencing".
- Participants will develop skills to understand what and how to communicate and present to different audiences

RISK CULTURE

- Through case studies, participants will learn the importance of risk culture. This discussion will focus on challenges of and solutions for implementing an effective risk culture.

Each morning the participants will have the opportunity to learn from a leading, senior risk practitioner.

Key program learnings include:

- *GRI ERM framework and the management of identified risks.*
- *Implications of global risks and trends on organizational strategies.*
- *Technological threats and opportunities.*
- *Risk culture as an important control and competitive advantage.*
- *Effective interface with the risk governance constituencies.*

Prereading will prepare participants to engage fully in the session discussions. A final exam will cover the topics and concepts covered over all of the sessions.
